		<p>The following is from an email Paul sent to the Clerk which covers the points he raised at the meeting.</p> <p><i>I reiterate and commit to the principles I set out: - The woods will not be touched, and we will look at how we can make these open for others to appreciate. As noted, David already more than willing to have people come walk and enjoy during the opening times for the business.</i></p> <p><i>The change of use and the manner the brown field site is looked at will be sensitive to the landscape we have sculpted over the last half a century. The house and the glasshouse at the top are being looked at to see how David (and myself) can continue to savour the environment we helped shape and certainly savour.</i></p> <p><i>Friday 19th, we are talking with more experts to look at the retail area. As noted, we have spent the last 3 years talking with others in the garden centre and gardening business about how we are to build on what is there. But the points regarding highways are there and we have to be sensitive to the limitations we have regarding heavy goods vehicles entering the Parish on a more systematic basis - Note Haynes transport as Bernard and family had looked at options for example.</i></p> <p><i>We shall make positives happen with the right foresight to feed back into development with a consideration for how we want things to develop noting what we can control, what we can influence and how we have make these controls and influences work for us.</i></p> <p>It was agreed not to object to the application.</p> <p>6.2 24/00703/HOU Single storey extension at 18 Carters Close - no objection. 6.3 24/00670/HOU Barn conversion 59 High Street – no objection.</p>
