

The Sherington Neighbourhood Plan was originally adopted as part of the Milton Keynes Development Plan in October 2017. It is time to review our Neighbourhood Plan and bring the policies up to date, reflecting the changing circumstances not only in our village, but also in the wider Milton Keynes area and National Planning Policy.

A consultation draft version of the Sherington Neighbourhood Plan has been produced, that takes the plan period forward to 2050, matching the emerging Milton Keynes City Plan 2050. The Neighbourhood Plan has been revised to remove policies that are no longer relevant, and to update the text to reflect current planning policy.

**No new housing allocations have been made**, and it is not intended to add any new housing proposals into the Neighbourhood Plan at this time. The plan allows for windfall housing to be delivered within the settlement boundary and retains the housing allocation at Water Lane from the previous plan.

This consultation will run from the 22<sup>nd</sup> August for 6 weeks until the 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2025.
